

BAND PERFORMANCE FLOW

Band Check-In

- When you first arrive at the University of Toledo you will be directed to **Band Check-In**, located between the two bus/truck parking areas along North Towerview Blvd.
- Band Check-In will open 30 minutes prior to the first band's warm up time.

Competing Band Name Badges and Field Passes

- You will receive a maximum of six name badges: one for yourself, plus five others submitted on the Fall Information Form. Name badges are valid for both prelims and finals.
- Each band will receive twenty-five field passes, valid for prelims only.
- **NEW IN 2016:** Bands may purchase up to an additional FIVE field passes on site at Band Check-In for \$15 per pass. Please refer to the 2016 BOA Adjudication Handbook for more details.
- Name badges and field passes are valid for flow areas and field access during your band's performance
 ONLY. Name badges and field passes allow entrance into the stadium concourse and spectator seating areas.
 Passes must be visible when entering the stadium.
- Field passes are not tradable and may not be shared with other participating bands. The use of field passes will be monitored and penalties assessed for abuse of the rules.
- Competing Band Field Passes for Finalist Bands will be handed out at the Finalist Director Meeting.
- Nurses are not exempt from the field pass policy and must have a pass if needed on field during your band's performance. BOA will provide an on-site medical crew all day.
- Bus driver wristbands will be distributed at band check-in. The number will be derived from your parking
 pass request form. Bus driver wristbands are valid for prelims and finals, for spectator entry only. Bus driver
 wristbands are not valid for field access.
- Bands of America does not provide bus driver hospitality areas.

Bus/Truck Parking Passes

- At the Toledo Regional, bus/truck parking passes are \$15. If you have not submitted a parking pass request and payment, please send payment at \$15 per bus or truck to our office no later than September 16, 2016 in order to receive your passes in time. If payment is not received, you may purchase passes at \$20 per bus or truck on-site.
- You will receive the number of parking passes indicated on your parking pass request form. These passes will be mailed approximately two weeks prior to each event.
- A Toledo Regional parking pass is required for each bus and truck. Please display the pass prominently in the front window of the vehicle. For the safety of your students and all attendees NO VEHICLES will be admitted to the lot without the appropriate pass.
- One Complimentary Staff Vehicle parking pass will be included with the bus/truck parking passes. Note that
 parking for one staff vehicle per band will be available NEAR the bus/truck parking area. All other
 personal vehicles need to park in a spectator lot.
- BOA is committed to providing safe and secure venues and events. Your compliance and cooperation are appreciated.

Bus/Truck Parking Location and Procedures

- The bus and truck parking lots are separate at this event.
- The bus parking lots are located northeast of the stadium, off West Bancroft St. in parking areas 1N and 1S.
- The truck parking lot is located directly north of the stadium, off Stadium Drive.
- To enter the Bus/Truck lots follow West Bancroft Street to North Towerview Rd (North Entrance to University of Toledo) and turn south on to North Towerview Rd. Busses will be directed into the lots immediately. Equipment Trucks will proceed south on North Towerview to Stadium Drive and turn left (South) and will be directed into Parking Area 10. BOA Volunteers will be on hand to meet you on arrival and give parking instructions.
- No eating is allowed in the Bus/Truck parking areas. Please utilize the Band Picnic Area, if needed.
- Warm up (musical or physical) is not allowed in the parking areas at Bands of America Events. Organized stretching is considered warm-up.
- If you wish to have additional warm-up or practice times, you must make your own arrangements off the University of Toledo property.

Band Warm-Up

- Warm up is located in the track and field stadium east of The Glass Bowl across Stadium Drive (see Site Overview Map). All warm up areas are grass surfaces. Please note that bands should keep participants and all equipment off of the track surface. Only the grass areas are to be used.
- It is your responsibility to report to your warm-up area at your scheduled time.
- While in warm-up, BOA staff will monitor your time and direct you to the Band Entrance Gate for your report time as listed on the prelim schedule.
- Your warm-up official will signal you, or someone you designate at 15 minutes, 5 minutes and 2 minutes before you must be clear of the warm-up area.
- Your pit will move toward and arrive at the stadium gate 15 minutes prior to the rest of the band.
- Bands may **NOT** warm-up or rehearse on site, except during their assigned warm-up period and **ONLY** at the assigned location. Remember, there is no warm-up (musical or physical) allowed in the parking areas at BOA events. **Failure to comply with warm-up regulations may result in a penalty.**
- If you arrive late for your warm-up time, you cannot stay past your 45-minute scheduled time. You will be dismissed from warm up on time so that you will arrive to the band entrance gate on time.

Percussion Warm-Up

Battery Percussion

• The battery warm-up area is with the band in the designated band warm-up area.

Pit Percussion

- A separate pit percussion warm-up is located across from the Truck Parking Lot in parking Area 5 (see Site Overview Map).
- Pit percussion may also warm-up with the band in the designated Band Warm-up Area, although this is not recommended due to distance from the stadium.
- Due to the proximity of the stadium, loud percussion instruments (cymbals, drums, etc.) may be disallowed during warm-up. Please be prepared to utilize only mallet keyboard instruments with soft mallets in the designated pit warm-up areas. There can be no sound bleed into the stadium.
- Pits will report to the Entrance Gate at their designated time (15-minutes prior to the band report time).

During Your 45-Minute Warm-Up

- Please note that if your band uses a wireless audio system, it may NOT be tested or used during your designated 45-minute warm-up. Channels may be the same from band to band and we want to prevent accidental overlap to a performing band on the field.
- You may only test your wireless audio system on the performance field.
- The use of Dr. Beats, jam blocks, other time keeping devices, and long rangers and megaphone amplification devices will be allowed only provided the following:

- 1) NO wireless audio systems will be allowed in the warm up areas.
- 2) The sound projected cannot interfere with the performances occurring in the stadium.

Motorized Vehicles

- Motorized vehicles are allowed into the stadium. All vehicles must have a bib (diaper) type covering underneath the engine of the vehicle.
- At no time may a motorized vehicle be inside the playing area of the field. Vehicles can only be driven on the turf or track surrounding the field.
- There must be some type of covering under the battery of any amplified equipment. There cannot be any acid, fuel, or oil drop on the turf.
- Please unlock the wheels on your front ensemble carts when in transport. To prevent damage to the playing field, it is recommended that all large instruments and props utilize pneumatic, or similar-style wheels of sufficient size and rating for weight.

Gate Dimensions

- The pit entrance/exit and band exit gate is 10'8" wide with no height restriction.
- The band entrance gate is 9'8" wide with no height restriction.
- Reminder: BOA's rules regarding the use of props at Bands of America events are still in effect. Be sure to read Part Two-Section 21.01 – page 18 of the BOA Adjudication Handbook - Props may not exceed 12 feet in height.

Field Marks Present

The field will have two sets of markings:

- NCAA markings 60' from the front and back sidelines and 40' apart (ticks and hash marks) in white paint.
- Traditional High School markings, additional tick marks only, will be placed on the field to divide it into equal thirds 53'4" from the front and back marked in yellow tape.
- Please refer to the Field Mark and Tunnel Dimensions Information page on the website.

Instrument Repair

• A small instrument repair kit and limited number of loaner instruments will be available if needed. Please see the band check-in area for more information.

Adjudication Panel and Commentary

- The adjudication panel for the Toledo Regional is Joel Denton, Chris Harris, Meghan McCourt, Steve Meyer, Matt Stratton, Becca Sullens and Mike Tarr. The Chief Judge for the Toledo Regional is Mike Rubino. Specific caption assignments will be distributed on-site at band check-in. Your post-event judging questions and concerns should be directed to BOA Chief Judge, Gary Markham, who can be reached at gary.markham@musicforall.org.
- Approximately 90 minutes after your prelims performance, you can check your primary director email for the link to your judge commentary and timing and penalties sheet. In most cases, this will happen before the 90minute mark.
- All adjudication sheets will be held until the **END** of the finals awards ceremony when you can pick them up at field level, along with prelims and finals recaps. You may designate someone with a director name badge to pick up your packet at the conclusion of the show.
- No scores or recaps (prelims or finals) will be released prior to the conclusion of the finals awards ceremony.
- If you do not stay for finals, your sheets will be mailed to you the Tuesday after the Regional.

Restrooms and Changing Facilities

• If your band needs to change into and out of uniform, a limited number of restrooms are available on the east side of the stadium at the band entrance gate (just inside the stadium).

- If you need to use these facilities, please go IN A SMALL GROUP. Please remember performances may be in progress. Groups should not impede the performance flow in any way.
- A limited number of port-a-lets will be available throughout the bus and truck parking lots.
- Since the concourse is quite a distance form the bus and truck parking lots, we encourage you to you're your students arrive in uniform.

Feeding and Watering your Band

- The designated picnic area is located northwest of the stadium next to the tennis courts (see enclosed map). Please remind your students to appropriately dispose of their cups and other trash after use.
- Eating is **NOT** allowed in the bus/truck parking areas because of safety concerns.
- Outside food and beverage is **NOT** allowed to be brought into the stadium, either by students or spectators.
- The stadium will be cleared and concessions will be closed during the dinner break between prelims and finals. Please review the Picnic Information document for more details about on-site picnic areas for use by bands.

Complimentary Finals Tickets for Non-Finalist Bands

- If your students do not perform in finals, tickets will be available for bands that wish to stay and watch finals. All students **WILL** need a ticket to enter the stadium for finals.
- Student tickets can only be picked up at the ticket booth between prelims and finals. We ask that only one representative from the band come to the ticket booth with proper band identification to pick up these tickets in a block.
- Tickets are for non-finalist students only, **NOT** for band staff and parents. Remember director name badges are valid for finals stadium entry, however those with prelim field passes will need finals tickets.

GENERAL INFORMATION:

Local Time

• At the time of the Regional, Toledo will be on Eastern Daylight Time. Please plan your travel and arrival time accordingly.


Spectator Information

- We recommend parking in the lots south of the stadium (Area 9, Area 18, or Area 19) or the East Ramp Parking Garage (Area 2) located at the corner of Douglas Road and West Bancroft Street. See attached maps for further information.
- There is no charge for spectator parking.
- Please note that North Towerview Boulevard will be closed to traffic and open to performing groups' busses and trucks only. Please use Douglas Road to access spectator parking.
- Outside food and beverage is **NOT** allowed in the Stadium. Please share this with your parents and boosters in advance.












Regional Championship at Toledo October 1, 2016 • University of Toledo • Toledo, OH SITE OVERVIEW MAP

BUS/EQUIPMENT TRUCK PARKING PASSES

Bus/Truck parking passes (the number purchased) will be mailed two weeks prior to your event. Bus/Truck parking passes are \$15 per pass if ordered prior to the event and \$20 if purchased on site.

Passes are required to enter the bus/truck unload and parking lots at the Regional. Only ONE complimentary staff vehicle pass will be provided per band. All other personal vehicles will need to park in a spectator lot.

There is no charge for spectator parking at the Toledo Regional. Please plan to arrive early and allow extra time to get to the stadium, especially during peak times. Refer to the Important Event Procedures document for further details.

COOPERATIVE TICKETS

All credentials and tickets (name badges, field passes, bus driver wristbands) are the director's responsibility to distribute. Your cooperative tickets (15 day passes) will be mailed to your director at least two weeks prior to the event. These tickets allow general admission to both prelims and finals. As there are no reserved seats at this venue, your cooperative tickets **cannot** be upgraded. Please communicate with your Director as to whom from your band will receive credentials and tickets. The only way an "adult/chaperone" can be at field level with performing students is with a name badge or field pass. Otherwise, all other "adults/chaperones" must

purchase a ticket. Ticketed patrons are not allowed at field level. Your director will receive a maximum of 6 name badges and 25 field passes which are numbered and documented per band. If needed, your band may purchase up to five (5) additional field passes on site at Band Check-In.

COPYRIGHT INFORMATION

Copyright Report and approvals are due now, and must be received by MFA prior to your band's performance. If your band has not submitted their Copyright Report and/or permissions to arrange, they will not be allowed to take the field until ALL of their copyright paperwork has been received.

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The Director's Lounge has information including the schedule of deadlines, Regional and Grand National ticket order forms, parking pass request form, ticket pass policies, patch order forms, event merchandise information, and more. Be sure to read these documents, as they will be important on the day of the event.

ADJUDICATION HANDBOOK UPDATE

Please be reminded of the following changes made to the BOA Adjudication Handbook for the 2016 season: Highlights (Section referenced in parenthesis):

- Updated language: Tempo-Specific samples and musical loops are not permitted during the performance. (Section: 14.16, 20.01)
- Bands will be allowed a reduced minimum performance time of six minutes. (Sections: 18.01, 18.05)
- Bands may only pre-set props and equipment in the designated staging area (end zone or front side)
 when directed by Bands of America officials. Enclosed venues (domes) may suggest a specific
 sequence of items in the flow. (Section: 21.04)
- Each band will receive 25 field passes plus 6 name badges as part of their participation cooperative fee. For 2016, a band may purchase up to 5 additional field passes on site at Band Check-In. (Sections 5, 8, 13)

Previous update reminders:

- Adults that operate a soundboard may not "contribute directly to the music or visual program" (ex. triggering sound or light effects, voiceovers, etc.) (Section 20.05)
- Props made of "soft materials" (ex. streamers, fabric, inflatables) are permitted up to a height of twenty-five feet. Props made of "hard materials" (wood, metal, plastic, PVC pipe), must still follow the existing twelve-foot maximum height rule. (Section 21.01)
- The list of items that are prohibited from use during performance has been updated to disallow off-road mechanized vehicles and drones, or similar aircraft items. (Sections 21.02 and 21.03)

BUS/EQUIPMENT TRUCK PARKING PASSES

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There is no charge for spectator parking at the Toledo Regional. Please advise your parents and boosters to arrive early and allow extra time to get to the stadium, especially during peak times. Refer to the Important Event Procedures document for further details.

COOPERATIVE TICKETS

Your cooperative tickets (15 day passes) will be mailed to you at least two weeks prior to the event. These tickets allow general admission to both prelims and finals. As there are no reserved seats at this venue, your cooperative tickets **cannot** be upgraded.
