GROUP TRAVEL HINTS

MOTOR COACH INSTRUCTIONS

1. Do not leave personal items on the coach overnight.
2. Food may be taken on board as long as the coach is kept clean. Drinks should be in plastic screw-top bottles.
3. Please treat your driver with respect.
4. Never flush foreign objects in the toilet! Once the chemical flush is full, it is unusable; use rest stops when possible.
5. Do not disembark until your escort or director releases you.
6. Please, NO Flash Photography while on board the motor coach!
7. Please remain seated while vehicle is in motion.

HOTEL INSTRUCTIONS

1. Read the instructions in your room concerning an emergency escape.
2. At curfew, you must be in your room. No one is to enter your room after curfew except chaperones or staff. Keep the noise level down.
3. Elevators are for *all* hotel guests; respect the other guests.
4. Telephones must not be used after curfew except in an emergency. You are responsible for outside phone charges to your room.
5. Keep your room locked! Keep track of the key.
6. No student is allowed in the room of a person of the opposite sex.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF CHAPERONES

1. This tour is designed for students. Be patient, flexible, and helpful.
2. Make sure everyone understands all instructions.
3. Communicate-get to know the students by name.
4. Make sure hotel rooms are in order upon arrival and departure.

5. Instrument, performance attire, uniform, & accessories (if applicable).

DESTINATION UNIVERSAL STUDIOS FLORIDA

Universal parks are very crowded. Be alert & aware of your surroundings.

1. Never be alone. Always stay with someone from our group.

4. Be cautious about striking up conversations with strangers.

8. Do all the things you really want to do before it gets crowded.
9. Obtain a park guide and map and prioritize your visit.
10. Be prepared for long lines and for warm conditions.
11. Start at the back of the park and work toward the entrance.
12. Eat park meals during off-peak hours.

MEDICAL/EMERGENCY INFORMATION FOR UNIVERSAL STUDIOS:

If you feel ill or need help, go to the park's First Aid Station. Designated chaperones will call the stations frequently. Medical attention will not be given to anyone under 18 without a chaperone present. On group arrival at a theme park, all first-aid/medical release forms will be dropped off at the park's First Aid Station.

FIRST AID CHAPERONE CHECK-IN INFORMATION

When chaperones call, a recording or an attendant indicates which groups, if any, have a student in one of the first aid stations. If you have a student in first aid, go immediately to the station. Phone numbers and locations follow.

ISLANDS OF ADVENTURE

The main Health Services station is in Sinbad's Village within The Lost Continent®, near Poseidon's Fury. Look for the Red Cross across from Oasis Coolers. A satellite First Aid Station is just inside the Guest Services Lobby, to the right of the main entrance turnstiles.

UNIVERSAL STUDIOS

The main Health Services station is located on Canal Street between the New York Street Set and the San Francisco Street Set, right across from Beetlejuice's Graveyard Revue™. A satellite First Aid Station is located at Family Services, located in between the First Union National Bank and the Studio Audience Center.

DESTINATION WALT DISNEY WORLD

Following the sensational 1955 debut of Disneyland in California, Walt Disney bought over 43 square miles of land in central Florida for a theme park, resort vacation center and a new city, the Experimental Prototype Community Of Tomorrow (EPCOT). After seven-plus years of construction, the Magic Kingdom opened October 1, 1971. Since then, the resort has added three additional parks—EPCOT (1982), Disney's Hollywood Studios (1989) and Disney's Animal Kingdom (1998), plus two incredible water parks (Blizzard Beach & Typhoon Lagoon), Downtown Disney (shopping/entertainment) and several golf courses.

Disney parks are very crowded. Be alert and aware of your surroundings.

2. Disney security personnel check all bags at each park's entrance.
3. Keep a firm grip on your belongings—wallets in front pockets.
4. Be cautious about striking up conversations with strangers.
5. If a stranger repeatedly annoys you, tell your chaperone.

7. Wear comfortable shoes and bring and use sunscreen.
8. Do all the things you really want to do before it gets crowded.
9. Obtain a park guide and map and prioritize your visit.
10. Be prepared for long lines and for warm conditions.
11. Start at the back of the park and work toward the entrance.
12. Eat park meals during off-peak hours.

DISNEY'S FAST PASS SYSTEM

To avoid long waits in line for popular rides and attractions, Disney's Fast Pass system gives you a way to maximize your enjoyment. Here's how it works: inside each of the four major parks "Fast Pass +" kiosks are scattered throughout. Occasionally, a kiosk is supplemented by a Cast Member with an iPad. Take your RFID-enabled Park Ticket to any FP+ Kiosk and reserve up to 3 FP+s for that day. Simply put your card in the machine or give it to the Cast Member. Both will display available times for each of the 3 attractions you choose. Pick the time, and your RFID-enabled Park Ticket is encoded. Take a picture of the screen times reserved with your phone, or write them down. At the attraction at the reserved time, tap your card on the gold Mickey Head, and you're admitted to the Fast Pass+ line. Here's some more tips:

1. You may select up to 3 FP+s per day, no more. All 3 must be in the same park, and they must be for different attractions (no riding Space Mountain 3 times.).
2. Each FP+ "Return At" window is 60 minutes long. The Return At windows cannot overlap.
3. Fast Pass attractions are indicated by "FP" on Disney World park maps.
4. Enjoy the shorter waits!

MEDICAL/EMERGENCY INFORMATION FOR THE PARKS

If you are ill, go to the First Aid Station. Medical attention will not be given to anyone under 18 unless a chaperone is present. Chaperones will call frequently. Medical forms will be given to the First Aid Station each day.

FIRST AID CHAPERONE CHECK-IN INFORMATION

Chaperone callers hear a recording telling which groups have a student in a first aid station. If you have a student there, go immediately to the station. Phone numbers & locations follow.
