Jazz Orchestra played at the regional Ellington festival. Had a great time at CCM with such a nice performance hall. Those kids played great and they had a wonderful clinic with their clinician. Had a couple of kids that were recognized for incredible soloists. Got some feedback from the students and it was mixed between the kids that preferred the Beavercreek vs the Ellington. Due to the linear nature the kids may get both experiences, Beavercreek as a sophomore/junior and then Ellington as a Junior/Senior. The spring concert is a bit different than the other as we transition from swing to other styles including each group playing a contemporary big band piece. It forces them to use all of the skills they have learned throughout the year. The contemporary big band is all stuff that is written really recently so it's cool to see the transition and common threads with older pieces. Concert in April.
